5 Signs You're Breaking the Toxic Generational Cycle

You learned to pause before reacting to your child

You've been yelled at as a child. You choose to manage your big emotions when you're triggered. You do whatever it takes (even walk away) to calm down first. Not every time. But **you do your best**.

You refuse to punish your child

You've been punished as a child and you felt scared and angry. Instead, you set firm boundaries and allow your child to experience natural consequences. You know that all behaviour is communication.

You do not say, "Because I said so!"

You've been told that growing up and you felt resentful. You choose to validate your child's feelings and **explain the reasons when you say** "No".

You do not comment on your child's weight

You know that all comments, even seemingly unharmful ones like, "Didn't you have enough to eat already?" can result in lifelong problems with body image and self-esteem.

You make sure your child knows you love them unconditionally

You grew up thinking that you're loved for your good grades and behaviour. You suffered all your life trying to "earn love". Instead, you let your child know they are loved just because they exist.

Every step, no matter how small, gets you closer to being the parent you want for your child.
