We tried the churro flavour yesterday, and it had such a good texture. When you bit into them, they had a satisfying crunch, followed by a dissolving ending that was so nice. These have a different flavor. They look sort of spicy. (because of the seasoning) If you smell them they will have a very strong smell, that lingers. When you first bite into them, one of the first things you notice is the color difference. The outside of the corn puffs is orange with a hint of brown (depending on the one). But the inside looks like cheese. The initial taste is bbq. Then as you get further through chewing through it, It starts to get smokier. Then finally the taste fades and gets sweeter. Amazing. My only feedback is that the aftertaste isn't strong at all. The corn flavour on the inside is too strong as well. Other than that though, I give this 10/10 *Henry*


