NEW STUDENTS AND THEIR WHANAU

We would like to welcome Annabelle (Year 5) and Christopher (Year 3) and their whanau to Roseneath School.

LANGUAGES

For Terms 2 and 3 we have Japanese and Maori sessions with our language tutors. This year we are structuring it differently as we are only doing languages for two terms. Japanese is now being taught to classes for 5 week in a row, in hope that will help students to retain new learning. We are continuing to offer Japanese extension for Years 5 to 8. At extension Japanese they also explore some of Japan's geography, history, writing, significant cultural events and days. Tomoko Burden has been working here at Roseneath for quite a few years and it is lovely to have her back this term.

For Maori, the whole school has it weekly. We break up into two groups 1- Years 1-4 and 2 - Years 5-8. The Year's 1-4 are working more on waiata-a-ringa (actions songs) and Year's 5-8 Kapa haka (a more formal action song's for performance). Through this the students will also learn some Te Reo Maori, Kawa (protocol) and Tikanga (customs). We have a new tutor this year in Matua Henare. He works in 8 schools in Wellington, so we feel fortunate to have him working here too.

SCHOOL PRODUCTION

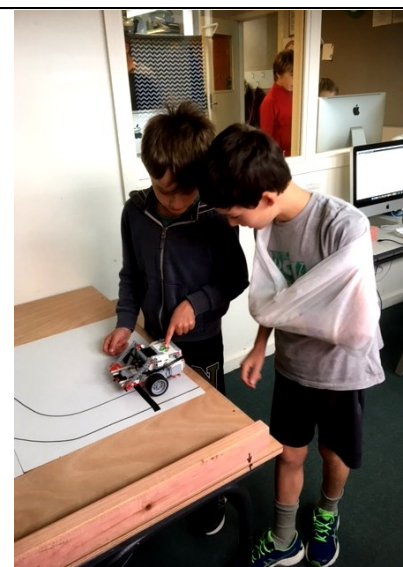
